The project "EURIBOR: Promoting sustainable actions for empowerment of vulnerable groups of youth women" (No. 2020-1-0049) is addressed to women 24-29 years old, not in employment, education or training, who are in vulnerable position: long term unemployed, with migrant or minority background, lives in small towns or rural areas, mothers with family obligations.

Through transnational and regional stakeholder cooperation of project partners with relevant local stakeholders, through employability programmes of on the job trainings, online courses and online entrepreneurship programmes supplemented with mentoring, EURIBOR will improve employment situation of youth women, increase number of women experiencing social inclusion and enhanced transnational cooperation on labour market issues. 380 women in vulnerable situation from targeted regions will be reached out and involved in EURIBOR programmes.

PROJECT OUTPUTS ARE BASED ON:

- Transfer of know-how
- Transnational and local multi-stakeholder cooperation with companies, local organizations and outreach officers
- Overcoming barriers to participation and outreaching strategies that works for vulnerable young women
- Holistic support of mobile team which includes psychological, social service and labour advisory support
- Employability programmes consisted of work-based training in non-traditional occupations and education for entry level job positions which address future-oriented jobs in training offerings and offer possibilities to youth women to work on-line from home
- Self-employability or online entrepreneurship programmes

PROJECT OUTCOMES:

1. Increased transnational cooperation on labour market issues

- By the end of project (2023), 12 eligible entities from EU Member States are taking part in transnational cooperation projects
- By the end of project (2023) level of trust between entities cooperating in the consortium will have scaled at maximum 5 points
- By the end of project (2023) 90% of involved individuals apply the knowledge acquired from the transnational consortium

2. Improved employment situation of NEETs/target group

- At least 12 jobs created
- At least 275 of target group engaged in active job search
- At least 110 of target group in the process of starting their own businesses

3. Increased number of NEETs/target group experiencing social inclusion

- At least of 275 target groups participating in inclusive activities (e.g. training and work-based learning)
- At least 70% of target group experiencing social inclusion, manifested through empowerment and/or social integration
